## Group D: Request 3.28

## [Answer from TEPCO]

- 1) All the workers are assessed with individual monitoring (including representative measurement), not caliculated from the assessments of workplace monitoring data.

  Because of the inundation caused by the tsunami, approx. 5,000 of the personal dosimeter became unusable and only approx. 320 APDs were able to use. This situation was continued until end of March and all the workers received APD on April 1<sup>st</sup>. During this period, if certain operation fulfilled the following 4 conditions, then the representative of the operation group wore the APD and doses of other workers were treated as equivalent to the representative.
- Dose expected to receive in each of operations is low.
- Environmental dose rate of the work place is known.
- Gradient of environmental dose is low.
- All the workers of the same operation group are engaging in the single task.
- 2) The required number of APDs were prepared on April 1<sup>st</sup>. After that, individual doses arose from the individual monitoring data.
- 3) Such conversion factors were not used (= factor 1).
